The Learning Alliance & Learning Alliance International Annual Proclamation Days are held at the beginning of the academic year in order to commend the effort and hard work demonstrated by our student body of class OI – AII and MYP I – DP II. The Learning Alliance Annual Proclamation ceremony is jointly held for the DHA (CAIE), Aziz Avenue and Faisalabad campuses, while the Learning Alliance International Proclamation is held for MYP I – DP II on campus.

PROCLAMATION AWARDS CRITERIA – CAMBRIDGE ASSESSMENTS INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

Students at Learning Alliance who have displayed a high level of commitment to academics and co-curricular activities during the past academic year are awarded medals and/or blazers at the Proclamation Ceremony. The criteria for awards presented at the ceremony is as follows:

ACADEMIC MEDALS CRITERIA

O LEVEL

Students in class OI-OII who have scored the highest cumulative results academically during their internal assessments over the course of the last academic year are awarded Gold, Silver and Bronze medals. These medals are presented to three students in each class level.

Additionally, students of the O level programme are awarded Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals on the basis of their CAIE O level results according to the following table:

National/International Distinction	Platinum
8 A*s/As and above	Gold
7 A*s/As	Silver
6 A*s/As	Bronze

A LEVEL

Students of AS and A Level are awarded Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals on the basis of their CAIE AS and A level results according to the following table:

National/International distinction	Platinum
3 A*s/As and above	Gold
2 A*s/As	Silver
1 A*s/As	Bronze





Abdul Salam Mehta Scholarship

Students who have consistently scored the highest 3 year cumulative results academically during the O level Programme in their CAIEs and internal assessments are awarded the Abdul Salam Mehta Scholarship. This scholarship is presented to two CAIE AS students in each campus: one each for Science and Humanities respectively.

Please note the Abdul Salam Mehta Scholarship is non-transferrable.

SPORTS MEDALS CRITERIA

Students from class OI-AII are eligible for receiving the following medals for displaying dedication and skill in overall sports activities (both in interschool and national/international competitions) during the last academic year:

Medal Type	Number of Medals Awarded	
Gold	2 medals (1 for boys, 1 for girls) for each class level	
Silver	2 medals (1 for boys, 1 for girls) for each class level	
Bronze	2 medals (1 for boys, 1 for girls) for each class level	

(If there is no student fulfilling the above criteria, the medal for that year for that class for that category will NOT be given)

Additionally, special medals are awarded to students for the following accomplishments:

- 1. Students who have been selected in an <u>official Pakistan Sports Team</u> to represent the country in an international competition will be awarded a Platinum Medal
- 2. Students who have participated in competitions (whether as a Pakistani representative, School representative, or individual entry) **and** have received one of the following positions:

CO-CURRICULAR MEDALS CRITERIA

One special medal per class level is awarded to students from class OI-AII for displaying dedication and skill in the last academic year (competitions as well as in-school activities) in co-curricular activities which may include but are not limited to:

- Public Speaking
- Visual Arts
- Performing Arts
- I.T/Science
- Community Service





- Environmental Initiatives
- Media & Publication

The medal is based on a rubric of traits displayed by students during their participation in the above activities. The student ranking the highest in the rubric in their respective class level will be awarded the Co-curricular special medal. These traits may include, but are not limited to the following:

- Active participation in school activities, as well as in interschool competitions (if any)
- Commitment in contribution in societal activities
- Initiative towards implementing positive change
- Team working skills, and conduct with peers
- Active attendance in society discussions

Additionally, special medals are awarded to students for the following accomplishments:

- 1. Students who have been selected in an <u>official Pakistan Team</u> to represent the country in an international competition will be awarded a Platinum Medal
- 2. Students who have participated in competitions (whether as a Pakistani representative, School representative, or individual entry) **and** have received one of the following positions:

Policy

- Students who have received a written disciplinary warning in the previous academic year would not be eligible for a Co-curricular Badge/Blazer.
- The recipient list for Blazers is renewed each year; Students may keep their Blazer as a souvenir and not wear it as part of their Formal Uniform if their status as an award holder is not renewed in the following academic year
- Students are also required to maintain minimum passing marks in their academics to continue their scholarship throughout the year.
- The decision is made at the School Board's discretion on voting basis. The decision is final and cannot be contested
- There is no fixed quota of Blazers awarded in this category
- The student may wear their Blazer as part of their Formal Uniform for that Academic Year.
- There may be instances where no co-curricular Blazers are presented in a particular academic year

STUDENT COUNCIL MEDALS CRITERIA

- 4 Medals are awarded from within the Student Council members of the last academic year for the following categories:
 - 1. Best Captain
 - 2. Best Vice Captain
 - 3. Best President
 - 4. Best Vice President



PROCLAMATION AWARDS CRITERIA – INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

Medals in the International Baccalaureate from Class MYP I – DP II are awarded according to the following criteria. <u>If</u> there is no student fulfilling the criteria, the medal for that year for that class for that category will NOT be given.

1. IB Student of the Year - Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This medal honors a student for demonstrating outstanding academic and extracurricular performance. The recipient of this award exhibits attributes such as Self-Discipline and Diligence. The student is not only Responsible, Punctual, Courteous and Confident, but is also a team player and an all-rounder. (Academics, IB Learner Profile Attributes, Co-curriculars and ATLs)

2. Academic Excellence Award – (Platinum, Gold, Silver & Bronze Medals /per class level)

Students in class MYP I - DP II who have scored the highest cumulative results academically during their internal assessments over the course of the last academic year are awarded Gold, Silver and Bronze medals respectively. These medals are presented to three students in each class level.

Platinum medals are awarded to students who achieve a world/national distinction.

3. Athletic Excellence Award: Male & Female – Gold Medal (2 medals/class level– for girls and boys respectively)

Students from class MYP IV – DP II are eligible for receiving a Gold Medal (2 medals per class level, for girls and boys respectively) for displaying dedication and skill in overall sports activities (both in interschool and national/international competitions) during the last academic year.

4. IB Young Leader Award – Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This accolade cherishes the leadership skills demonstrated by the IB learner including crisis management, conflict resolution, driving change while taking ownership for causes beyond one's domain. The learner showcases agency and encourages the members of the community by role-modelling as an inspiration to others.

5. IB Agent of Change – Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This award celebrates exemplary initiative demonstrated in areas pertaining to Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS). The IB learner has consistently left a tangible footprint through a remarkable zeal for community, within and beyond the school.





6. IB Visual Artist of the Year (Visual Arts) - Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This award is given to the students who excel in one or more areas of artistic expression. This includes drawing, painting, sculpture, crafts, multimedia design etc. This also includes participation and active involvement in various Art and Design endeavours for the community to help and inspire others.

7. IB Performing Artist of the Year (Music, Performing Arts) - Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

Performing Artist is expressly for individuals who excel in one or more of the performing arts. They can specialise in music, dance, theatre performance, drama, or singing or production design. Nominees are expected to demonstrate outstanding talent, which has been evident in notable personal or school achievements.

8. IB Tech Whiz – Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This award is given to a student who understands technical concepts and knows how to apply them in various contexts, is well informed about modern technology, especially computers and software, and is proficient in their use. The award recipient also has the right skills and intuitive knowledge to operate modern devices effectively.

9. IB Math Maven - Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This accolade celebrates the mathematical wit exhibited by the IB learner. Not only is the IB learner keen on exploring the complexities of math but is also driven to extend this knack for numbers in the school community.

10. IB Literary Laureate – Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This accolade is conferred upon an IB learner for an exquisite literary flamboyance. The learner showcases an inexhaustible love for literacy. The student cherishes the charm of languages and literature through a remarkable zeal for literary initiatives, within and beyond the classrooms.

11. IB Stellar Scientist – Gold Medal (1 medal/class level)

This award recognizes the ardour for scientific inquiry in varying streams of science. The IB learner who is awarded this medal exhibits Einsteinian zest for science through analysis, interpretation and demonstration of scientific knowledge.

12. IB Rising Star – Silver Medal (1 medal/class level)

This award commends the diligent efforts made by a student in both academic and extra-curricular avenues. This entails growth in horizons encompassing social, emotional and personal skills. The learner surfaced as an emergent IB Star by consistent progress throughout the academic year.

13. Naeem Salam Mehta Award - Gold Medal (1 Medal)

The Naim Salam Mehta (NSM) Scholarship is an academic award for the highest scorer in the MYP V eAssessments for the duration of two years. This 100% tuition fee waiver is on the current tuition fee for the IB Diploma Programme.
